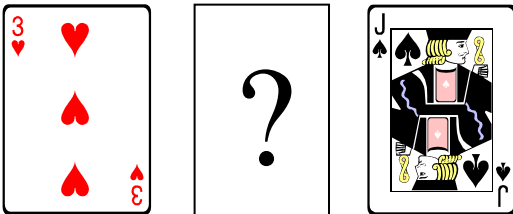


Red Dog (Acey Deucey)

Red Dog (also known as Acey Deucey) is a very easy game to learn and play. Aces are always high, deuces are always low. Players begin by placing a bet. The Dealer then deals out two cards – these two cards will serve as the hand for all of the Players. The Dealer then deals a third card. If the value of the third card dealt falls in between the values of the first and second cards - all the Players WIN!

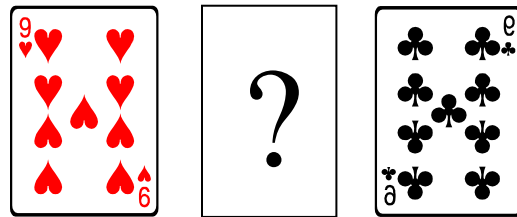
Here are the different types of RED DOG hands that can be dealt:

NON-CONSECUTIVE:



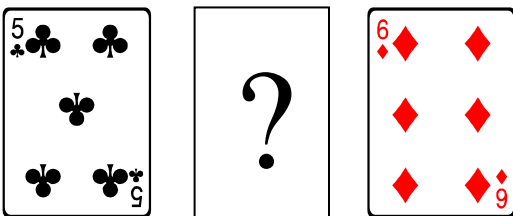
The Dealer will announce the spread after dealing two cards. (*The spread is the number of cards that could fall between the first two dealt cards.*) In the example above, the spread is 7. At this time, Players may raise their bets up to the amount of your original bet (doubling their bet). The Dealer then turns up a third card. If the value of the third card falls between the values of the first two cards, everyone wins!

PAIR:



You cannot raise your original bet when a pair is dealt. The Dealer draws the third card. If the hand is three of a kind, the players win 11 to 1. If the Dealer does not draw three of a kind, the hand is a TIE, and players do not win or lose.

CONSECUTIVE:



If there is no spread – and the cards are not a pair – the hand is a tie (as shown above). You do not win or lose. The Dealer does not deal a third card. Players can either let their bets lay for the next hand, increase them, or remove them.

PAYOUTS

3 of a Kind.....	Pays 10 to 1
1 Card Spread.....	Pays 5 to 1
2 Card Spread.....	Pays 4 to 1
3 Card Spread.....	Pays 2 to 1
4 Card or more Spread.....	Pays 1 to 1
